This issue is in response to various questions raised with committee members, in person, by telephone, or email, which probably come under the rubric of FAQ (*frequently asked questions*). There have been quite a number of house sales in Mosshead over the last year and it appears a number of new owners do not know East Dunbartonshire and are looking for advice. We hope this is of help.



PLANNING ISSUES Your Committee has objected to various planning applications of late, usually by inviting the inclusion of Mosshead Residents Association within the umbrella of an objection by Bearsden North Community Council. However the Council does advertise (briefly) some of the applications in the back pages of the *Milngavie and Bearsden Herald*, and you are advised to look out for such advertisements. If the application is for a Bearsden location you should be able to examine the relevant plans and written applications at The Triangle in Bishopbriggs. Large local developments are sometimes displayed in Brookwood Library.



CARE AND REPAIR this is an organisation allied to East Dunbartonshire Council "EDC" aimed at local residents over 75 years of age, or those aged 60 upwards if disabled. The intention is to offer advice, perhaps recommend a company, for various works needing done. Owner-occupiers have to pay, council tenants should not. Care and Repair is at 3 Cowgate, Kirkintilloch, and the tel. no. is 0141 578 0156.

SKIP HIRING

it is best to be aware that rented skips should NEVER be placed on pavements or grass verges (since there are usually some utilities beneath these areas which the weight of a full skip can damage). The residents (not the skip owner) should approach the Council for a permit to place a skip on the road. If they can get it into their driveway or within their own garden there is no need for a permit.

STREET TRADER's LICENCE

the Association has objected to an application for a licence to site a mobile van on Stockiemuir Avenue on weekday lunch hours between Dumgoyne and Campsie junctions, where the two SLOW signs are painted on the road surface. It is to be hoped that this licence will not be granted for many reasons including road safety, increased litter, and being contrary to the Scottish Government's initiative to promote healthy eating habits amongs the nation's youngsters. We are delighted to report that Bearsden North Community Council has also submitted an objection to this application.

YOUR LOCAL COUNCILLORS remember if you have issues with local Council matters you are best to consult your local councillors in the first instance. PET DOGS dogs should be on the lead when being walked in a built up area, and their owners should pick up any dirt and deposit the same in the various dog bins provided by the Council. We are quite well supplied with these bins, given that we have a busy Veterinary Centre on Stockiemuir Avenue, so there is no excuse for not keeping the ground clean.



YELLOW BOX JUNCTION the Roads Department are putting in a yellow box junction at the Stockiemuir Avenue/Stockiemuir Road junction, which has become difficult to negotiate at peak times with the introduction of traffic lights at the entrance to the new Academy.

PUBLIC 'CONVENIENCES' the nearest public 'telephones' to Mosshead are both at Bearsden Cross, one in Drymen Road near the Marie Curie Charity Shop, and one outside the Bearsden Post Office on Roman Road. The only local public 'toilets' are within the Roman Road car park at Bearsden Cross just beyond the Post Office.



LENNOX COURT & ROTHERWOOD COURT FLATS (Stockiemuir Avenue) - These flats are all privately owned, in spite of local gossip. They never have been Council owned, and owner-occupiers are responsible for the cost of their upkeep (the current factor is Hacking and Paterson of Glasgow). All the grassed areas round the flats are tended by a private company hired by the factors.

The upkeep of the grass verges such as those along the pavements on Stockiemuir and Seafield Avenues is the responsibility of the Council's Connect Services. The areas around, the Sheltered Housing (Stockiemuir and Buccleuch Courts), the terraced housing from 5-15 Stockiemuir Avenue, and the school are likewise the Council's responsibility.
